Bank of America today announced it will provide an additional \$335,000 to support the critical needs of New Jersey communities affected by Hurricane Sandy. The funds are in addition to a \$1 million contribution announced last week, which will benefit the American Red Cross and national, regional and local nonprofits supporting recovery efforts.

"Many New Jersey residents are still in recovery mode, with a long road ahead of them," said Bob Doherty, New Jersey president, Bank of America. "This additional support will benefit local nonprofits that are addressing the most basic needs, including food and shelter."

With this latest commitment, Bank of America has provided a total of nearly \$600,000 to relief efforts throughout the state. This includes \$225,000 of the previously announced \$1 million contribution, which was allocated to the Community FoodBank of New Jersey, the Hurricane Sandy New Jersey Relief Fund and Jersey Cares. 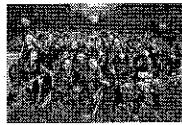
